Are idlers beneath feed hoppers and skirt plates/ 6 boards adequately guarded? 7 Are steel grids fitted to the top of accessible hopper loading points where practicable? 8 Is there adequate vehicle edge protection on vehicle ramps at hopper loading points? Is there a suitable wheel stop in place in front of 9 hopper loading points? Are gravity take up devices adequately guarded? 10 Are fixed guards secured using a captive type 11 fastening which requires a tool for removal? 12 Is regular access required inside perimeter/ distance guarding? 13 If Y to 12- have suitable electrical interlocks/ captive key systems been installed on access gates? 14 If Y to 12 - Do guarding and isolation systems prevent a person entering a 'live zone' via access from an 'isolated zone'?
