Safe tractor driving for children 13 and over

By law* any child aged 13 and over can, with appropriate permission and supervision, drive a tractor engaged in agricultural activities on private land in Northern Ireland, providing they hold a nationally recognised certificate of competence in the safe driving and operation of tractors. The certificate of competence can be obtained by completing a relevant machinery course such as a LANTRA certified course.

Suitable courses are available from:

College of Agriculture, Food and Rural Enterprise, CAFRE, Enniskillen, Loughry and Greenmount campuses.

Course duration

4 days including training and assessment. Courses are normally arranged in the summer holidays but also at Halloween, Christmas and Easter.

Course fees

If students have a Farm ID number the fees are £24. Otherwise £427**.
